ACT Exams

Every student in 9th, 10th and 11th grades will be taking an ACT exam on **Tuesday, March 3, 2015.** Freshmen will be taking ACT Explore. Sophomores will be taking the ACT Plan and all juniors will be taking the ACT exam.

The ACT exams are mandatory for each student and the DOE is paying for each student to take this exam.

Please be sure that your child is at school ON TIME on Tuesday, March 3.

Students should NOT be taken out of school early on this day for any reason, as it will affect test completion.

Your student needs to get a good night's sleep, eat breakfast before coming to school (no recess that day); and bring a fourfunction, scientific or graphing calculator. All cell phones should be left at home.

(If a cell phone is brought to school that day, it will be collected at the beginning of testing and returned at the end of the test.)

<u>SAT and ACT 2014-2015</u>

To register for either the ACT or SAT, students must create their "login" and "password" for each test. Students register online, paying with a credit card. When asked for the high school code, Kalaheo High School's Code is 120143 for both tests. Students are encouraged to send their scores to four colleges for free at the time of registration. Scores released AFTER testing may incur a cost per each release.

<u>NEW-</u> For both the SAT and ACT, you must upload your headshot photo AT THE TIME OF registration. Read the instructions to ensure the correct type of photo.

.Fee waivers are available to juniors and seniors who are eligible for free/reduced lunch. Be sure to submit the necessary paperwork with Kalaheo High School to determine your eligibility. See Ms. Inouye in H-208, if you have any questions.






LO'S LORNER
